## **What is Pdf+?**

Pdf+ lets you view PDF documents, also known as Adobe® Acrobat® files, on your iPhone and iPod Touch. Optimized for mobile phones, Pdf+ is very easy to use, fast, small and packs a lot of features.

## **Compatibility.**

Pdf+ is compatible with all iPhone and iPod Touch models.

## **Installing Pdf+**

Pdf+ is installed through AppStore. You can use AppStore's search function to look for Pdf+ and buy it. AppStore will then install Pdf+.

Alternatively, you can buy Pdf+ using your desktop computer and iTunes. Press this link (<http://www.mBrainSoftware.com/iPhone/Pdf/Pdf.htm#Buy>) to get you started.

## **Using Pdf+**



Start Pdf+ by tapping its icon in the home screen. The first time you start Pdf+, it will show the contents of its top-level documents folder. This manual will be the only file visible.

Pdf+ remembers which folder or PDF document is has opened last, and the next time you open Pdf+ it will reopen the last folder or document. Documents will even show the same page and zoom level.

Pdf+ can also open password-protected documents. Pdf+ will ask you for the password when you open such a document, if you do not know the password you cannot open it. If the last-opened document is password-protected, Pdf+ will ask for that password when it reopens the document.

## The folder view



The folder view shows a list of PDF documents. You can also use folders to organize your PDF documents. In the folder view, you can create folders, download PDF documents from the Web, start the upload server and display information about Pdf+ itself.

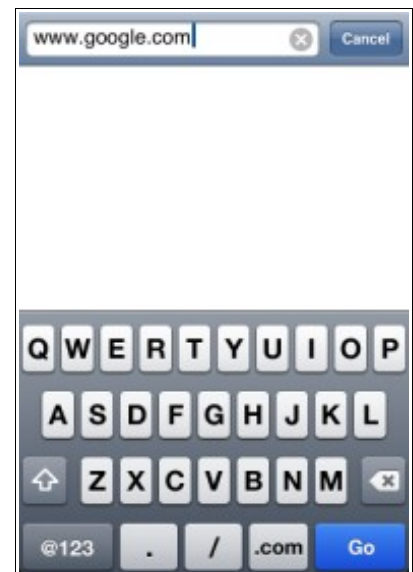
You can also delete PDF documents and folders using swipes, and you can use the Edit button to delete and rename documents and folders.

Pdf+ can only open PDF documents. Other files are shown but cannot be opened.

## Downloading PDF documents from the Web

Pdf+ has a built in Web browser you can use to search for and download PDF documents from the Web. Downloaded PDF documents are stored in the folder that was showing when you pressed the Download button.

If a downloaded file turns out not to be a PDF file, Pdf+ will show it with a special icon, and it will not open the file.



## Uploading PDF documents using a Web browser

Pdf+ has a built in Web server showing the files and folders that are managed by Pdf+. You can also upload PDF documents using the Web browser on a desktop computer. You can only connect to the Pdf+ Web Server when your device is connected to a local network, and the desktop computer has to be connected to the same local network.



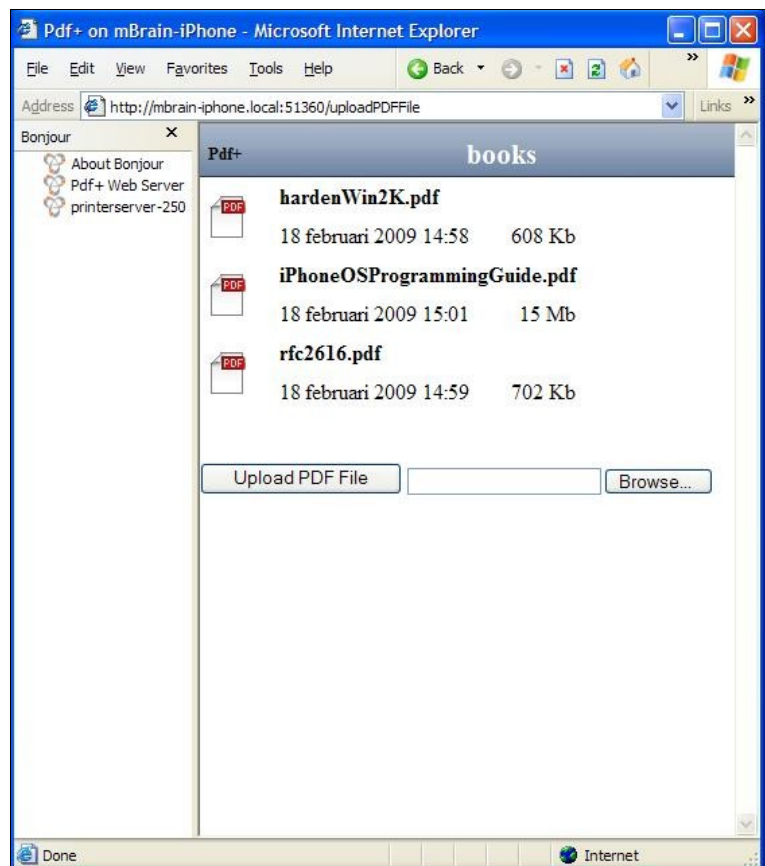
Pdf+ uses [Bonjour](#) to publish itself as a Web server, but you can also use the server URL or the IP address to connect to the Pdf+ Web Server. Using the server URL or the IP address is less convenient than using Bonjour, but it works with all web browsers.

The Safari Web browser has Bonjour built in, you might need to enable it in Safari's preferences. Apple also has a [Bonjour plugin](#) for Internet Explorer. If you are using another web browser, you can check with Apple or your browser's manufacturer whether they have a Bonjour plugin for your browser by now.

Safari is generally very quick in spotting the Pdf+ Web Server, but Internet Explorer and other browsers are a bit slower on the uptake. You might need to try to connect a couple of times.

After a connection has been established, you will see the same list of PDF documents and folders as on your device. Clicking a folder displays the contents of that folder, clicking on a PDF document copies that document to your desktop computer, where the web browser will use a local PDF reader to display it. Safari will also display a proper Back icon on the right, other browsers only display the parent folder name.

You can also upload PDF documents to the folder that is shown. Navigate to the file you want to upload using the Browse button. Then press the Upload PDF File button to upload the file. When the upload has succeeded, you will see the folder being refreshed.

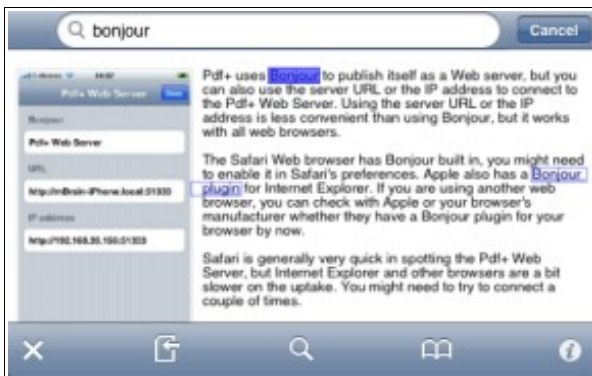
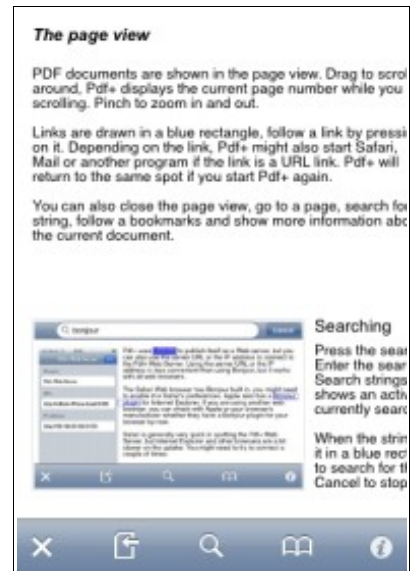


## The page view

PDF documents are shown in the page view. Drag to scroll around, Pdf+ displays the current page number while you are scrolling. Pinch to zoom in and out.

Links are drawn in a blue rectangle, follow a link by pressing on it. Depending on the link, Pdf+ might also start Safari, Mail or another program if the link is a URL link. Pdf+ will return to the same spot if you start Pdf+ again.

You can also close the page view, go to a page, search for a string, follow a bookmarks and show more information about the current document.



## Searching

Press the search button to start a search. Enter the search string and start the search. Search strings are case-insensitive. Pdf+ shows an activity indicator and which page it is currently searching.

When the string has been found, Pdf+ displays it in a blue rectangle. Press the search button to search for the next occurrence, and press Cancel to stop searching.

## Bookmarks

Tapping a folder opens that folder, tapping a bookmark shows the page the bookmark points to.

## Document information

PDF documents keep track of some meta-data, which is shown in the Document Information view.
